This morning while tossing apples into the tractor bucket another 'Deputy' showed up. He brought their laptop so he could document. I told him what my practice was and he said he wished more growers would follow suit. The conversation only went uphill from there. He checked out the stings and cut into them, no worms. He said that the worm ingested the CYD-X I mixed in with the core recipe and died shortly after stinging, which is normal. He said my orchard was something to be proud of. I told him I'm a noob, and I had not expected to hit any home runs, but hoped to not strike out. Holistic 2 - Conventional 0

I must say, once I got by the intimidation factor I have found these gentlemen to be pleasant, helpful, and supportive. I welcome them into my orchard at any time.
