I've got easy, fairly cheap access to some well rotted horse manure (1-1.5 years old). The bedding used was sawdust. I was going to use this composted manure during planting in the Spring. I'm digging 3' diameter holes for the trees and I want to make sure the hole gets completely topped up--even a little high--when planting. We've got heavy clay soil so I'm concerned about water pooling too much around the tree. Figured I could use the compost to make up for any soil lost in the refill. I'm concerned that the sawdust will have made the rotted manure too acidic, however. I figured since it's well rotted that it won't suck much ntirogen from the soil. Any thoughts on this plan?
