Some of my Titania black currant bushes seem to have the fungal disease "currant cane dieback" which has apparently re-emerged after being absent during the prohibition against growing black currants because previous varieties carried the white pine blister. This re-emergent fungal disease can kill the whole bush. According to the attached research (which explored a number of control approaches on several varieties), sulfur combined with pruning diseased canes was effective.
