I've been using a Master Gardener rechargeable electric hand cart mounted sprayer for about 5 years now. With an extendable spray wand I can get good coverage up to 20'. It has double the capacity of a backpack sprayer and can be pulled either by hand or behind a 4 wheeler. It cost a little over \$200 when I bought it.
