Even though we are mostly in throes of a mild yet ongoing winter, the growing season will soon be upon us. This will be the third year that I have offered a Holistic Orcharding webinar series for interested growers from novice to advanced. There is a heavy emphasis on science - both traditional and esoteric - all designed to bring a practical understanding of how and why holistic orcharding works.

On Feb 18 (830-1030a EST), there is a FREE introductory session where we will go through the syllabus topics discussing the trajectory of the course throughout the year.
