Hi James,

Thanks for the photos, that is always helpful in a case like this.

Do they spray this tree with anything, annually, or perhaps just this year? Late Copper (after fruit set) sprays are known to increase the likelihood of russetting, for example, and that would often then manifest on the sunny side (the exposed side of the apple), which could account for the russeting only being on one side, as your photos show.

Other sprays, besides copper, may do the same . . .

What is weird about russeting is that it can be caused by mildew, and that spray remedies for mildew can cause it. It may be that, since no sprays were made, those areas with less circulation have some wet induced russet. However, if there really is some mystery associated with the variety, how do we know it does not have russet as a genetic characteristic? With these days of excitement over rough skinned heirlooms, you might try to get that russet on the other half too. There is something very attractive to a russet netting on a big red haralson, despite it being a so called blemish.
