This morning's low temperature was 27 at 6am, zero wind, clear skies and more cold (26!) and even snow projected for Saturday night. I applied my first holistic spray this past Sunday.

Is there any hope for my poor pears? :: sigh:: They are planted at the highest point on our property so I am hopeful but time will tell....

The cold is supposed to penetrate all the way to North Carolina. I'm sure a lot of apple trees in the Midwest and eastern US are in trouble as well.

27 degrees now and supposed to go down a few more degrees. Perfectly clear sky and zero wind. My espaliered pears are wrapped in burlap as a couple of them are in full bloom. Apples showing pink. Hoping for the best....

Well, we made it down to 25 for a brief moment and now, at 8:20, we are up over freezing. Many local vineyards had huge fires going early this morning to try and save their vines. I guess their concern is with the sap freezing.

The freeze is now behind us here in Northern VA. I hope everyone else that is impacted by this frigid air comes through it ok without widespread crop loss.
